Our Plant Diagnostic site has been completely redesigned. The new site is database driven with dynamic web pages and a custom search engine which will make it easier for you to find information.




### Site Directions:

- From the menu on the left, select a category, like Plant diagnostic.
- A new page will be displayed with a listing for assorted plants, such as Lawns.
- Click on the type of problem and a new page will be displayed with symptoms and possible causes with photos.
- Browse the causes for each symptom and click on "go" to select that cause; or if there is more than one cause use the pull down menu to go to the other cause.
- From there simply read the information, on the problem and solution that appears.
- You can go to another plant part by selecting "from the menu" at the top of the page.



The custom search engine works much like Google, but only searches within the Plant Diagnostic Site. Enter a key word or phrase and it will return all relevant results.
